

ECON—ECONOMICS OPTION 2008-2009

The Economics option focuses mainly on economics and is designed to provide students with an understanding of the present economic system and how economics relates to other disciplines and fields of study. The major is designed for students who desire to study economics but do not wish to take all of the common requirement courses prescribed for Business Administration majors. Students majoring in Economics will have the flexibility to pursue minors in other areas as well as preparing for teaching certification.

¹An upper-division Economics course used to satisfy the Economics option may not be used to satisfy any other major, minor, or option within SOBA, except that an Economics course used to satisfy the Economics option may be used to satisfy the 300- or 400- level Economics requirement in the Business Administration major (where required).
